



November 23, 2021 Commissioners Meeting

Minutes

A meeting of the Board of Commissioners of Colfax County, Nebraska was held in the Commissioners Room of the County Courthouse, Schuyler, Nebraska on the 23rd day of November 2021. The County Board of Commissioners met at 8:30 a.m. Present were: Carl Grotelueschen, Jim Mejstrik and Terry V. Wendt, County Commissioners and Rita M. Mundil, County Clerk. Notice of this meeting was given in advance thereof by posting written notice in at least three different public places as shown by the Certificate of Posting Notice. Availability of the proposed agenda was communicated in the advance notice and in the notice to the board. Copies of the Open Meetings Act were posted and available to the public. All proceedings shown were taken while the meeting was officially convened and open to the public.

Motion Mejstrik; second Wendt to approve the agenda. Voting YES: Grotelueschen, Mejstrik and Wendt. Voting NO: None. Motion carried.

Motion Wendt; second Grotelueschen to approve the minutes of 11/9/2021. Voting YES: Mejstrik, Wendt and Grotelueschen. Voting NO: None. Motion carried.

The clerk provided the fund balance, September Lodging Tax Revenue and STOP Revenue received. Correspondence from Nebraska Commission on Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice confirmed that on November 29, 2021, the Colfax County Jail facility will have its annual inspection for the Nebraska Jail Standards Board.

The vet service officer provided October 12, 2021, November 9, 2021 and November 23, 2021 claim reimbursements of services for Colfax County Veterans which will all be placed on file.

The inmate log from Butler County was provided to the board and placed on file.

Julie Kreikemeier/Extension Educator gave a report of the activities of her office per phone conference; recommendations for Colfax County Extension Board for District #1 and District #2 were given. The county attorney gave a report of the activities of her office; discussion was held if the county should participate in the proposed Opioids Settlement Agreement with Johnson & Johnson, Janssen Pharmaceuticals, Inc, Ortho-McNeil-Janssen Pharmaceuticals, Inc. and Janssen Pharmaceutica, Inc. (collectively "Janssen"). The clerk will contact the state auditor to inquire if there are any restrictions on how the settlement funds are to be used and if a separate fund needs to be created. The sign-on period for subdivisions ends on January 2, 2022. This item will be placed on our December 14th meeting.

Will De Roos/Schuyler City Administrator and Chief Farber addressed the board concerning a joint law enforcement center and the possibility of building a jail. The board asks for more information on the costs and budgets before making any comments.

The Zoning/Flood Plain administrator gave a report of the activities of her department; DEE notice on Labenz Farms Concentrated Animal Feeding Operation for NPDES General Permit for Operations Confining Cattle was reviewed.

Motion Mejstrik; second Wendt to open a public hearing at 10:00 a.m. for the purpose of hearing testimony of support, opposition, criticism, suggestions or observation for Resolution 11-23-2021(2) to add the following Article 3 General Regulations, Section 3.40 Accessory Dwelling Unit to the Colfax County Zoning Regulations. Voting YES: Grotelueschen, Mejstrik and Wendt. Voting NO: None. Motion carried.

The zoning administrator included in her report that the Resolution is an amendment to the Colfax County Zoning Regulations by adding Section 3.40 Accessory Dwelling Unit - ADU to the Zoning Regulations/Matrix as well as definition of Accessory Dwelling Unit. This will allow a build on the home place next to the parents. Presently a hired hand is allowed to dwell. It is the recommendation of the planning commission to approve the addition/amendment of Article 3 General Regulations, Section 3.40 Accessory Dwelling Unit to be allowed through Conditional Use to the Colfax County Zoning Regulations.

Pursuant to 23-151 along with the most recent federal decennial census (2020) the county board reviewed five proposals from gWorks for redistricting commissioner boundaries. Motion Grotelueschen; second Wendt to adopt Resolution 11-23-2021(5) which establishes commissioner district boundaries as follows:

- A. Commissioner District Number One: Richland, Shell Creek, Wilson, Stanton, all that part of the City of Schuyler lying south of the center of Fifteenth Street and east of Fort Street and south of the center of Fourteenth Street and west of Colfax, and all that part of Schuyler Precinct lying south of the Union Pacific Railroad Right-of-way and west of Colfax Street (Highway 15), containing, 3,534 residents.
- B. Commissioner District Number Two: Grant, Midland, Adams, all that part of the City of Schuyler lying north of the center of Sixteenth Street, north Fifteenth Street, north of Fourteenth St and all that part of Schuyler Precinct north of the Union Pacific Railroad Right-of-way, containing 3,673 residents.
- C. Commissioner District Number Three: Rogers, Colfax, Maple Creek, Lincoln Precincts, and all that part of the City of Schuyler lying south of the center of Sixteenth Street and east of Colfax Street and all that part of Schuyler Precinct south of the Union Pacific Railroad Right-of-way and east of Colfax Street (Highway 15), containing, 3,375 residents.

Voting YES: Mejstrik, Wendt and Grotelueschen. Voting NO: None. Motion carried. Resolution 11-23-2021(5) in its entirety is on file in the county clerk's office.
