October 15, 2024 Commissioners Meeting Minutes

A meeting of the Board of Commissioners of Colfax County, Nebraska was held in the Commissioners Room of the County Courthouse, Schuyler, Nebraska on the 15th day of October 2024. The County Board of Commissioners met at 8:30 a.m. Present were Carl Grotelueschen, Jim Mejstrik and Terry V. Wendt, County Commissioners, Rita M. Mundil, County Clerk and Bruce J. Prenda, County Attorney. Notice of this meeting was given in advance thereof by posting written notice in at least three different public places as shown by the Certificate of Posting Notice, publication in the Howells Journal on October 2, 2024, and the Colfax County's website. The availability of the proposed agenda was communicated in the advance notice and in the notice to the Board. Copies of the Open Meetings Act were posted and made available to the public. All proceedings shown were taken while the meeting was officially convened and open to the public.

The Chairman stated a copy of the Open Meeting Act statute is posted and available to the public.

Motion Grotelueschen; second Wendt to approve the agenda. Voting YES: Grotelueschen, Mejstrik and Wendt. Voting NO: None. Motion carried.

Motion Grotelueschen; second Wendt to approve the minutes of 9/24/2024. Voting YES: Mejstrik, Wendt and Grotelueschen. Voting NO: None. Motion carried.

No report from the General Assistance Clerk.

The Clerk provided the Board with a copy of her monthly fees, STOP Revenue received, change of safekeeping receipt with Pinnacle Bank and Election Procedures for Voting for NACO Officers. County Government Day will be held on October 28th. Correspondence from Nebraska Department of Natural Resources provided information on special mitigation funding opportunities for flood-prone properties in Nebraska.

The Board received a copy of the monthly fee report from the District Court Clerk.

The Sheriff's September monthly report was provided to the board and placed on file.

The Vet Service Officer provided his monthly report and claim reimbursements for September 24th and October 8th to be placed on file.

The Board received a copy of the September Public Defender report.

The Treasurer provided a change of safekeeping receipts from Citizens Bank.

The 3rd quarter CASA report was provided to the Board.

Travis Prochaska/Extension Educator reported that he is currently gathering harvest data, will be attending the fall conference, and provided the Board with an update on the interviews held for their open positions.

The County Attorney presented his quarterly report on criminal filings and has been working with the Planning and Zoning Administrator on wind energy and compost facility regulations. He reviewed the FY2025 Community-Based Juvenile Service Aid (EB Supplemental Funding) grant application with the Board. Motion Grotelueschen; second Mejstrik to authorize the chairman to sign the FY2025 Juvenile Service Aid EB Supplemental Funding Grant application with the crime commission. Voting YES: Wendt, Grotelueschen and Mejstrik. Voting NO: None. Motion carried.

The Weed Superintendent reported that he has successfully earned both his General Commercial Applicator License and Right of Way Applicator License. As a result of his passing the required tests, his pay rate will increase \$1.50. River spraying is scheduled to start next week.

The Board provided an opportunity for county employees to attend an "Agenda-less meeting."

The Treasurer discussed the 2023 & prior delinquent tax list with the Board. The Treasurer's recommendation is to have nineteen County Sales Tax Certificate written. Motion Mejstrik; second Grotelueschen to approve the Treasurer to write nineteen County Tax Sale Certificates. Voting YES: Grotelueschen, Mejstrik and Wendt. Voting NO: None. Motion carried.

Carrie Rodriguez and Sarah Ryba from District 5 Probation presented the Interlocal Agreement between Butler, Colfax and Saunders Counties and the Administrative Office of the Courts & Probation. The agreement is for the continuation of the Fifth District Problem-Solving Court program. Motion Grotelueschen; second Wendt to approve the Interlocal Agreement for a two-year renewal of the Problem-Solving Court program. Voting YES: Mejstrik, Wendt and Grotelueschen. Voting NO: None. Motion carried.

Recessed at 9:50 a.m. and reconvened at 10:00 a.m.

The Zoning Administrator provided an update on permits issued. The Planning and Zoning Commission will hold a public hearing on wind energy and discuss composting at their October 16th meeting. A public hearing on wind energy is scheduled October 29th for the Board of Commissioners.

The Clerk discussed the possibility of opening a checking account with Pinnacle Bank for Health Deductible Reimbursements in coordination with Mid-American Benefits, LLC. Currently, Mid-American Benefits, LLC manages this account, but they recommend that, for best practices in client claim funding, clients should have full ownership and control of their bank accounts. Motion Wendt; second Grotelueschen to authorize the County Clerk to open a checking account with Pinnacle bank and to transfer \$7500 for a beginning balance. Voting YES: Wendt, Grotelueschen and Mejstrik. Voting NO: None. Motion carried.

Motion Grotelueschen; second Mejstrik to approve the certification statement for fiscal year ending June 30, 2023, with Maximus for determining indirect costs associated with administration of child support services conducted by the District Court Clerk. Voting YES: Mejstrik, Wendt and Grotelueschen. Voting NO: None. Motion carried.

The Highway Superintendent provided updates on road and bridge projects, guardrail damage, completed crack sealing, and ongoing ditch cleaning. At the next meeting, bid openings for Projects C19(542) and C19(387) will be held, with discussion, consideration, and take action scheduled for the November 12th meeting.

Discussion was held on purchasing a motor grader by state bid. Murphy Tractor & Equipment was present to answer any questions. Motion Grotelueschen; second Mejstrik to authorize the purchase of a 2025 John Deere motor grader by state bid for the purchase amount of \$399,500.00 less trade in of a 2011 motor grader in the amount of \$65,500.00 totaling \$334,000.00. Voting YES: Grotelueschen, Mejstrik and Wendt. Voting NO: None. Motion carried.

Public comments were made of a replaced mailbox and a STOP sign found in a field.
