The Highway Superintendent gave a report on the activities of his department. Equipment purchases and budget were discussed. Gravel bids will be received and publicly opened at 10:30 a.m. on April 8th with discuss, consider and/or take action to follow.

The "Colfax County Aggregate Hauling" bids that were received by the 10:30 a.m. deadline were publicly opened and read. Three companies submitted bids. The Highway Superintendent recommended accepting all bids for aggregate hauling.

Motion Grotelueschen; second Mejstrik to accept the three bids for aggregate hauling with the lowest bidder being the 1st company to be called. Voting YES: Mejstrik, Wendt and Grotelueschen. Voting NO: None. Motion carried.
