A meeting of the Board of Commissioners of Colfax County, Nebraska was held in the Commissioners Room of the County Courthouse, Schuyler, Nebraska on the 14th day of January, 2014. The County Board of Commissioners met at 8:30 a.m. Present were: Mike Dvorak, Jerry Heard and Gil Wigington, County Commissioners, Rita M. Mundil, County Clerk and Denise J. Kracl, County Attorney. Notice of this meeting was given in advance thereof by posting written notice in at least three different public places as shown by the Certificate of Posting Notice. Availability of the proposed agenda was communicated in the advance notice and in the notice to the board. Copies of the Open Meetings Act were posted and available to the public. All proceedings shown were taken while the meeting was officially convened and open to the public.

The chairman stated a copy of the Open Meeting Act statute is posted and available to the public.

Motion Dvorak; second Wigington to approve the agenda. Voting YES: Dvorak, Heard and Wigington. Voting NO: None. Motion carried.

Motion Dvorak, second Wigington to re-organize for 2014 and appoint Jerry Heard to serve as county board chair for 2014 and authorize Gil Wigington to sign documents in absence of county board chair. Voting YES: Heard, Wigington and Dvorak. Voting NO: None. Motion carried.

Motion Wigington; second Heard to approve Resolution 1-14-14(2) which provides a 2.5 increase to the salaries of officials, deputies, appointed officials and employees under the authority of the county board (November's CPI was 1.2). Voting YES: Wigington, Dvorak and Heard. Voting NO: None. Motion carried.

Motion Heard, second Wigington to approve Resolution 1-14-14(3) setting the salaries for the term starting in 2015. Voting YES: Dvorak, Heard and Wigington. Voting NO: None. Motion carried.

Recessed at 9:50 a.m. to resume at 10:00 a.m.

The Zoning/Flood Plain administrator gave a report of the activities of her department; the board acknowledged correspondence from FEMA providing official notification that we have until April 16, 2014, to adopt and/or submit a floodplain management ordinance that meets or exceeds the minimum NFIP requirements. The board will adopt the updated NFIP FIRM's at February 11<sup>th</sup> meeting.

Frank L. Hayes and Lynette Allen of Hayes & Associates presented the final FY12-13 audit to members of the board; they provided a power point and reviewed the audit and were available for questions and comments. It was also stated that their office will mail the audit to the state.

Culvert bids that were received by the 11:00 a.m. deadline were publicly opened and read. Three companies submitted bids. Action has been deferred until the January 28, 2014 meeting.

The personnel committee met on April 14,

2014 and discussed amendments to the Colfax County Personnel Policies and Procedures Manual on Travel and Reimbursement Policy. Motion Wigington; second Dvorak to approve the following amendment by Resolution 4-22-14(1):

#### **Travel Expenses**

Multiple Day Tripe

Reimbursement will be made for only those reasonable travel expenses strictly essential to the transaction of County business. Please see your department head for further details.

#### **Meal Reimbursement**

Colfax County will reimburse employees for meals and incidentals based on the following per diem allowance established by the Colfax County Board of Commissioners.

There will be no reimbursement for meals at a conference/meeting where a meal was provided. All meals purchased during the inclusion period of an overnight trip will be paid or reimbursed. The maximum daily allowance amount will be set by Board resolution and will not include tips and gratuities. Itemized receipts must be provided for meals where reimbursement is requested. There will not be any expenditure or reimbursement with public funds for the purchase of alcohol.

#### Lodging

Expenses incurred for actual lodging costs appropriate to the purpose of the trip will be paid or reimbursed. Direct billing to the County shall be used when possible. The County Clerk's office may be contacted for information on County tax numbers and references for direct billing requests.

Colfax County will not pay a hotel bill if it is within 60 miles of your hometown unless there is a cause to stay overnight such as inclement weather that will not allow you to come home or travel would be too risky to come home or if a person's meeting goes into the evening hours and then is required to be back at the same location the next day.

#### Mileage Reimbursement

An employee will be reimbursed at the rate per mile set by the IRS for mileage allowance for Employer approved travel in the employee's personal vehicle for work related travel.

#### **Travel Policy**





Travel time of non-exempt employees who are required to attend a meeting, conference, seminar, training course, etc., is considered compensable time. Authorized travel time shall be that required by the most efficient common carrier. The provisions of this paragraph shall not affect entitlement to other authorized travel and expense allowance.

A non-exempt employee traveling for one day (not overnight) shall be paid for all travel time. This travel time is counted when computing hours worked for overtime purposes.

A non-exempt employee traveling by common carrier on overnight business shall be paid for all travel time. However, only hours of travel which are within the employees normal scheduled work hours are counted when computing hours worked for overtime purposes (this includes travel hours on weekends, or holidays). The non-exempt employee's time spent traveling shall be paid at their normal straight time rate when the employee's travel meets the following conditions:

- -outside of normal scheduled work hours;
- -on overnight business;
- -by common carrier; and
- -employee is not doing actual work while traveling.
