A meeting of the Board of Commissioners of Colfax County, Nebraska was held in the Commissioners Room of the County Courthouse, Schuyler, Nebraska on the 12th day of January, 2016. The County Board of Commissioners met at 8:30 a.m. Present were: Mike Dvorak, Jerry Heard and Gil Wigington, County Commissioners and Rita M. Mundil, County Clerk. Notice of this meeting was given in advance thereof by posting written notice in at least three different public places as shown by the Certificate of Posting Notice. Availability of the proposed agenda was communicated in the advance notice and in the notice to the board. Copies of the Open Meetings Act were posted and available to the public. All proceedings shown were taken while the meeting was officially convened and open to the public.

The chairman stated a copy of the Open Meeting Act statute is posted and available to the public.

Motion Wigington; second Dvorak to approve the agenda. Voting YES: Dvorak, Heard and Wigington. Voting NO: None. Motion carried.

Motion Dvorak; second Wigington to re-organize for 2016 and appoint Jerry Heard to serve as county board chair and authorize Mike Dvorak and Gil Wigington to sign documents in absence of county board chair. Voting YES: Heard, Wigington and Dvorak. Voting NO: None. Motion carried.

Motion Wigington; second Dvorak to approve the following appointments to the following agencies: NENEDD-Dvorak; CNJHA-Heard; Region 4/ODD (aka North Star)-Wigington; Region 4/MH-Wigington; NE Nebr. Correspondence from Nebraska Commission on Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice states that the Colfax County Jail facility was determined to be in full compliance with the Standards at the time of the inspection. Information on the 2016 NACO Institute of Excellence, a year-long program was distributed to all officials by email.

The Colfax County Personnel Committee finished reviewing the Colfax County Employee Handbook in September of 2014. The County Attorney submitted the handbook to Pam Bourne for her to review. The Personnel Committee will meet January 25, 2016 to discuss presenting the handbook to the board for their adoption without having Pam Bourne's recommendations.

The Zoning/Flood Plain administrator gave a report of the activities of her department; she informed the board that she has successfully completed the process and examination to become an ASFPM Certified Floodplain Manager (CFM). Correspondence was read from FEMA stating that this letter is their official notification that we have until April 5, 2016, to adopt and/or submit a floodplain management ordinance that meets or exceeds the minimum NFIP requirements. An informational meeting on Flood Insurance Options for buildings that will be newly mapped into a High-Risk Area will be held on Tuesday, February 2, 2016, beginning @ 7:30 p.m. in the Colfax County Courthouse Community Room. The Nebraska Department of Natural Resources will be present to discuss and answer questions concerning insurance and the new flood maps.
