A meeting of the Board of Commissioners of Colfax County, Nebraska was held in the Commissioners Room of the County Courthouse, Schuyler, Nebraska on the 10th day of January, 2017. The County Board of Commissioners met at 8:30 a.m. Present were: Jeffrey L. Bauman, Jerry Heard and Gil Wigington, County Commissioners, Rita M. Mundil, County Clerk and Denise J. Kracl, County Attorney. Notice of this meeting was given in advance thereof by posting written notice in at least three different public places as shown by the Certificate of Posting Notice. Availability of the proposed agenda was communicated in the advance notice and in the notice to the board. Copies of the Open Meetings Act were posted and available to the public. All proceedings shown were taken while the meeting was officially convened and open to the public.

The chairman stated a copy of the Open Meeting Act statute is posted and available to the public.

Motion Wigington; second Heard to approve the agenda. Voting YES: Bauman, Heard and Wigington. Voting NO: None. Motion carried.

Motion Bauman; second Heard to re-organize for 2017 and appoint Gil Wigington to serve as county board chair and authorize Jerry Heard and Jeffrey L. Bauman to sign documents in absence of county board chair. Voting YES: Heard, Wigington and Bauman. Voting NO: None. Motion carried.

Motion Wigington; second Heard to open a public hearing at 10:00 a.m. for the purpose of hearing testimony of support, opposition, criticism, suggestions or observation on a conditional use application by Commercial Construction, Inc., for excavation of material to be used in the construction of the Highway 30 project between Schuyler and Rogers on approximately +/- 6 acres belonging to Robert and Kathleen Rausch in the Flex District. This is located in part of the Northwest Quarter of the Southwest Quarter (pt. of NW ¼ of the SW ¼) along Road 17 just North of Highway 30 in Section 2, Township 17N, Range 4E, East of the 6<sup>th</sup> P.M. (Principal Meridian) of Colfax County, State of Nebraska. Voting YES: Bauman, Heard and Wigington. Voting NO: None. Motion carried.

The zoning administrator included in her report that the applicant wants to enlarge an existing pond and use the excavated material for construction of Highway 30 project between Schuyler and Rogers. An existing contour map along with a proposed contour map of the site has been submitted. The borrow site is in the AO Floodplain overlay district and all floodplain regulation must be followed. Adequate drainage paths shall be required in order to guide floodwaters away from structures and any other property not belonging to the applicant(s). Notice has been posted and published and all fees have been paid. It is the recommendation of the planning commission to approve the conditional use application.

This is located in part of the Northeast Quarter (NE1/4) just south of Highway 30 and west of Road 18 in Section 11, Township 17N, Range 4E, East of the 6<sup>th</sup> P.M. The NACO renewal rate for the county's health insurance will have an overall 14% increase (PPO plan with \$1500 individual/\$3000 family in-network calendar year deductible), and the dental plan rates will remain the same (Dental PPO Premier Option 3) for period of July 1, 2017 to June 30, 2018. Motion Wigington; second Bauman to approve the 2017 NACO Subgroup Application Form which shall provide to eligible county employees health and dental coverage through the NACO endorsed program provided by BCBS. Coverage will provide a PPO-\$1500 deductible on health and a Dental PPO Plan. The 2015 & prior delinquent tax list was reviewed by the board and the treasurer.

Representatives from Colfax County Library Association addressed the board to request funds for the libraries of Colfax County. Letters from the Clarkson and Schuyler Libraries were presented; the Director asked for our continued support with an increase of \$4500.00 changing the contribution to \$32,000.00 per year for the County Library Association.

The Zoning/Flood Plain administrator gave a report of the activities of her department; permits issued for the fiscal year was reviewed.

The sheriff discussed a deputy who will be losing his insurance for his daughter in January 2018; to add her to his policy it is very costly. The sheriff is requesting that since the county pays both single policies for the employee and his spouse, if the county could pay a family premium with them paying the difference. The commissioners received a legal opinion from the benefit attorney with NIRMA who reviewed the county's personnel handbook and felt this arrangement would fit within the language of our handbook. ### **Section 8.12 Solar Energy**

No solar panel shall be constructed within the zoning jurisdiction of Colfax County unless a Zoning Permit therefore is approved and is constructed in conformance with the state building codes and the following requirements. For those devices that include electrical, plumbing and heating constructions, the applicable permits shall also be obtained. Solar panels shall meet the following requirements.

8.12.01 Lot and Height Requirements:

Solar panels shall conform to the required front, side and rear lot setback requirements except as provided herein:

- 1. A solar panel which is attached to an integral part of the principal building may project two feet into the front yard; six feet into the rear yard; and two feet into the side yard.
- 2. A solar panel which is freestanding may be located only in the required rear yard provided it is not less than five feet from the rear lot line and not closer than one foot to any existing easement as measured from the closest point of the structure including its foundation and anchorage's, nor shall the solar panel be located in the required side yard or front yard.

8.12.02 Structural Requirements:

The physical structure and connections to existing structures shall conform to the applicable state building codes.





8.12.03 Plot Plan:

The application for a permit shall be accompanied by a plot plan drawn to scale showing property lines, existing structures on the lot, proposed solar panel location with respect to property lines, and dimensions of the proposed solar panel.

8.12.04 Permit Fees:

Permit fees are required. This permit fee shall be paid prior to the issuance of the zoning permit.

8.12.05 Preexisting Solar Panels:

Notwithstanding noncompliance with the requirements of this section, a solar panel erected prior to the adoption of these Regulations, pursuant to a valid building permit issued by the County, may continue to be utilized so long as it is maintained in operational condition.
