Jaime M. Jakub/Disabled American Veterans (DAV) presented an overview of the key pros and cons of purchasing a vehicle through their program. The county's veteran service officer then presented a Fact Sheet of the Platte/Colfax County Veteran Van Program and answered questions of the county's program.

Lumir Jedlicka and Jerold Kracl representatives for Knights of Columbus discussed displaying "In God We Trust" to be located on the outside of the courthouse. The commissioners stated the motto will not be placed on any terra cotta due to the recommendation of the engineer of the county's restoration project. Examples of the possible lettering to be placed on the top glass of the front door entryway were reviewed. This item will be placed as an action item once the KC's provide the final design (the KC's will be funding this project).

Concentrated Animal Feeding Operation on a NPDES General Permit for Operations Confining Cattle and Foghorn Hill, LLC Concentrated Animal Feeding Operation for Construction and Operating Permit.

The zoning administrator included in her report that the Resolution is the adoption of Flood Insurance Rate Map (FIRM) Panels found on the FIRM Index #31037CINDOB, and the Flood Insurance Study #31037CVOOOB by March 21, 2019, to avoid suspension from the NFIP. If suspended, the County becomes ineligible for flood insurance through the NFIP. It is the recommendation of the zoning administrator to approve Resolution 1-29-19(1) that adopts the measures that meet the requirements with Title 44 Code of Federal Regulations Sections 60.3(d) of the NFIP for the Howells levee.

The county surveyor was present and commented that he would like this position to be kept on the ballot as an elected position.

The highway superintendent reviewed the projects in the one-year plan and the six-year plan.

The highway superintendent gave a report of the activities of the road department; employee evaluations were completed. Auditors suggestions were reviewed where State Bid purchases need to be kept on file by pdf. (proof of state bid cost) or have the state bid attached to the claim.

Commissioner Mejstrik entered the meeting at 10: 55 a.m.

The board interviewed two applicants for the public defender position; discussion was held on the Public Defender contract and review of the interviews. Instruction was given to the clerk to contact the top candidate and offer the position with an effective date of January 14, 2020 where the appointment of public defender would be made.
